Qualifications:

- 60 hours of college credit or an associate degree in a human services (or a related) field and two years experience in a child welfare agency, or other setting that serves children, adolescents, or both children and adolescents; preferred
- Must pass all required federal & state background checks.
- Can provide 3 references attesting to the good character, reputation, interpersonal, and professional skills of the applicant.
- 21 or older
- Is living and modeling a healthy lifestyle.
- Must have the physical ability to climb stairs and carry up to 25 pounds up or down a flight of stairs.

Main Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Remains awake and observant all night,
- 2. Exercises good judgement at all times,
- 3. Provides routine monitoring of participants for optimal safety & security,
- 4. Maintains accurate documentation and other time sensitive paperwork,
- 5. Facilitates compliance with agency policies and procedures, and licensing requirements,
- 6. Assists in handling emergencies and difficult situations,
- 7. Prior to leaving at shift's end, ensures area is clean & organized,
- 8. Accurately communicates all pertinent information to supervisor and to other staff during shift change,
- 9. Maintains confidentiality regarding agency and clients accessing services,
- 10. Assists with extra additional tasks as a member of the team.

Necessary Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Of good character and reputation, exercising sound judgement,
- Experienced & demonstrates ability to work with youth,
- Understands child and adolescent development,
- Values being part of a team; Embraces diversity,
- Capacity to deal with conflict,
